


Pantomime

Other trips this term that have worked alongside our educational themes in class have included Ramsgate fire station, which was not only informative but a lot of fun.






Clip and Climb, the students loved. Over the 2 weeks, determination and resilience were in abundance and all students were adventurous.

Neptune

Neptune have had another busy term, both in and out of the classroom. We finally received our first tree delivery with 420 saplings turning up ready for planting. Though the weather has now turned we were able to get out on one of our brighter days to plant some.





Neptune attended the fire station in Ramsgate for a visit. We were kindly shown around, learning about all the different aspects of the station. The students impressed with their conduct, interest and questions. The highlight was a chance for students, and staff to sit in the fire engines and pose for some photos.







As usual, Neptune again showed their love of sport. They attended the Thanet Inclusive Sports dodgeball session based at Hartsdown Leisure centre.

The students also attended a football tournament in Aylesham where, on a rain-soaked day they competed against other SEN schools from the local area. They conducted themselves extremely well and went on to be undefeated all the way to the final, where they were beaten (narrowly) by the eventual winners.







Saturn

Saturn class have had a busy term, starting with pumpkin picking at Felderland Farm, followed by carving at Halloween.



Students also visited various colleges for tours, looking at areas of interest, such as engineering, music and art departments. These visits were extremely successful with outstanding behaviour and fantastic careers advice.

Participation in Odd Sock Day, for Anti-Bullying Week; Children in Need cake sale; Wonderdome Science; baseline assessments; Pantomime trip to the Marlowe Theatre and Ice Skating at Quex, are some of the many activities our students have completed.





Saturn class all contributed to the class Christmas decorating competition, as well as the table decorating. For Saturn's assembly they presented the history of Christmas Jumper Day, talking about Save the Children and Christmas morals.



Jupiter

At the start of the term Jupiter and Saturn had several trips booked based around cultural capital and careers. This helped pupils to gain a better understanding of a possible transition into further education. It also offered an insight into the skills needed to apply for jobs and possible career options.

They started off by visiting colleges. Pupils selected from a range of colleges which included Canterbury, Broadstairs, Dover and Folkestone. The colleges offered pupils a tour and information them on the courses they run and what is needed to attend the college. Notably, pupils were very excited to see Dominator II from the Robot Wars series and learn about the mechanics behind the build. Further to this, a VR/streaming room that Dover campus had to offer gave a great insight into the progress of technology in the colleges.

Thank you to all pupils for their engagement on the tours and for being great ambassadors for the school.

Pupils from Jupiter had mock interviews with Education Business Partnership, where they were also able to discuss any questions that remained after the college visits.

We had a visit to the Fire Station in Ramsgate where we met staff. They told us about their job roles and responsibilities and the wide number of jobs that the fire service attends. They kindly gave us a tour of their facilities where we saw their offices, sleep quarters, training facilities and we even got to look at a fire engine known as 'the pump'.







During lessons in the afternoon, we have been working towards our Duke of Edinburgh silver award. One part of the course is bike maintenance. We visited Halfords where we bought cleaning equipment. We are now in the process of doing up and making two bikes safe by firstly creating a list of the faults.





As a class we have been taking care of the school animals. We made sure they had food and were kept clean and safe over this cold period. We have been learning in our Land Based lessons about how to risk assess each individual animal and how to work out their needs. We have been looking at how to treat issues such as red mite on hens and exploring what space they require to remain healthy so they can exhibit normal behaviour.

To finish off a super busy year we all went to see a pantomime, ice skating and all made Christmas decorations in the hope of winning one or all of the three school competitions. Best dressed tree, best dressed classroom and best dressed table. This is a photo of our nativity which we all made. Therapy

This half term pupils in Jupiter class have participated in Fun and Healthy Food sessions as part of our new independent living offer over in the therapy house. Pupils have made smoothies and fruit kebabs, practising cutting and decorative skills.

Pupils in Mars and Neptune class have been further testing out our scooter boards to their limits in sensory circuit sessions! Learning how to work together as a team and against each other competitively in short station activities and practising different strategies to support calming including use of the body socks, stretchy tunnel, and body scan videos.



All pupils had the opportunity to experience our interactive 'Wonderdome' workshop this half term. Pupils climbed into the giant dome and learnt a wide range of facts about space and the role of an astronaut.



We've had further staff training on the Thrive approach, staff have practised a Thrive based activity of making memory jars, which has been embedded in class sessions and Carolyn our Speech and Language Therapist has delivered training on language disorders.

We would like to welcome our new therapy assist ant Lucy Gaughran to the team. Lucy has experience working as a teaching assistant in an SEN school and will be supporting pupils with their OT and SaLT sessions and the embedment of the Thrive approach. Furthermore, we are pleased to announce that Rob (psychotherapist) will be working an additional day (Thursdays) as of term 3 to support both pupils and families.

DofE

This term Saturn class have made a great start to their voluntary work at Monkton Nature reserve. This work placement for the Saturn class will continue for three months until the end of February to fulfil the requirements of the bronze DofE award.



Our young people have been working mainly outdoors in the reserve and have completed a variety of tasks from clearing leaves to path maintenance to overseeing the bird feeders. The manager and educational officer of Monkton Nature Reserve have already praised our young people for their positive attitude and work ethics. The reserve would also like the students to feature in an article in one of their own newsletters. Well done Saturn class, an excellent start to your voluntary work.



Welcome to our art gallery. Here are some of the great creations which the pupils at Life Skills Manor have created this term as part of their GCSE course work.




